Pastor's Page

Greetings Summer Hill!

Our 2024 Vacation Bible School program was a huge success! Each evening during the week of June 17-21, close to 35 children, 15 volunteers, and lots of parents gathered inside and outside of St. Paul's Summer Hill UCC to celebrate God's wonderful gifts and blessings, and to learn more about the Saving Grace of Jesus Christ. This year was extra special as we joined with St. Paul's Summer Hill Lutheran church to combine our efforts and kids. But perhaps you never attended VBS and have wondered what all the excitement was about or if VBS is still relevant in today's world! Here's a quick summary of why we continue to sponsor our program each year.

VBS is a vital mission of our church: The purpose of VBS is to minister to children and families in the church, create outreach to the surrounding communities, and to create evangelism opportunities. This mission is supported with creatively themed Bible study, activities, worship, and even time for some tasty snacks.

VBS is a dependable ongoing ministry. Kids that attend a VBS program typically come back year after year. Even some of the shyest little ones have surprised their parents by exclaiming, "I can't wait to go back!" VBS creates lasting memories. Parents and our volunteers shared stories of their days attending VBS, to include the friends they made, crafts they created, and the Bible lessons they learned. It is a blessing to know that our children still have the opportunity to experience these activities that will create lifelong memories and help start them on their faith journeys. VBS is a special event that creates memories that help lock Bible truths in a child's heart and mind for a lifetime.

Birthday parties and other special events have themes that use creativity to evoke feelings of excitement. Games, food, decorations and fun all link together in a total package. VBS does the same thing. When we connect with kids through this ministry, the biblical truths that permeate all aspects of VBS also connect with their hearts and minds.

VBS is an opportunity to share the gospel and is an intentional evangelistic opportunity. Some of the children who attend do not have the opportunity to go to weekly church or Sunday school. They may have limited exposure to Bible stories or Jesus' teachings at home. Even some of the parents have a limited knowledge of what our faith community is all about. VBS is a great way to introduce the story of Jesus Christ and how God's love for each of us leads to eternal life.

This year our VBS program theme was "Scuba, diving into friendship with God," and was full of cool underwater ocean referenced fun. During the week, kids explored themes like, 'God is a friend who's real,' 'God is a friend who loves,' 'God is a friend we can trust,' 'God is a friend forever,' and 'God is a friend for evervone.' Kids participated in memorable Biblelearning activities, sang catchy songs, played teamwork-building games, made and devoured yummy treats, experienced one-of-a-kind Bible Adventures, collected Bible Memory Buddies to remind them of God's love for us, conducted science experiments that demonstrated the wonders of God's world, and made awesome crafts they got to take home to remind them about God the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.

The good news is that our VBS program did not end with the closing program on June 21st. It will continue all year long with three bonus dates throughout the year where the kids will meet for an afternoon of crafts, snacks, games and fellowship. Keep a look out for those dates to be announced.

If you know of children that would love to join us, or if you would like to be part of the fun and volunteer your time to help introduce Jesus into the lives of our children, come to our next Board of Christian Education meeting on Tuesday, July 2nd at 7:00 PM in room B1 off the fellowship hall. We would love to have your help as we continue to dive into friendship with God.

Christian Symbol



CATHEDRAL FLOOR PLAN — Traditionally, a cathedral is laid out in the shape of a cross. The lower section or nave (from Latin for *ship*), along with the transepts (the arms of the cross), is where the congregation sits. The choir sits on either side of the chancel. Despite our common terminology, the sanctuary (from Latin for *holy*) isn't the full worship space but the area right before the altar. The location of the lectern, from which Scripture is read, and pulpit, used for preaching, may vary.

Confirmation Class Sign-ups

It's time to register for Confirmation class. 1st year confirmation classes are available to any young adult turning 12 or entering 7th grade this year.

To register, please turn in a completed form to the church office by **Sunday**, **August 25**th. Confirmands will identify someone to serve as their mentor. Mentors must be either persons currently serving on Consistory or a member of the Spiritual Council and may not be immediate family members.

Confirmation Classes will begin on Rally Day Sunday, September 8th at 9:15 AM, with a confirmand, parent and mentor meeting. At this time, confirmation requirements and expectations will be reviewed with confirmands, their parents and mentors signing the Confirmation Covenant. A blessing of the Confirmands will be conducted during Worship after the meeting.

Use this chart to guide you in determining your level of generosity.


