Pastor's Page

Greetings Summer Hill!

It is hard to believe that we are already heading into the home stretch of summer! They say time sure flies by when you are having fun, and this community of faith has been having a lot of fun this summer.

In addition to the many wonderful family vacations that so many of our members have taken this summer, St. Paul's has had numerous events and fellowship opportunities that have kept us busy.

We kicked off the summer season with a trip to the ballpark to see the Reading Phillies win on a perfect evening complete with fireworks. We have had our outdoor worship services and 'Bring your motorcycle to Church' Sundays. We have had small group outings, to include a golf outing at Hidden Valley, kayaking, and enjoying God's beautiful creation.

We have welcomed new faces into our community, baptized children, and had weddings. We have volunteered our time in support of the Schuylkill Haven Council of Churches and helped out at the food bank and raised funds to feed the needy and support local organizations.

But as we approach the end of the summer break, we are now looking forward to our traditional Rally Day which will be held on Sunday September 8th. 

Each of us who joined St. Paul's Summer Hill United Church of Christ, pledged our support and participation by answering the following questions.

Do you desire to affirm your baptism into the faith and family of Jesus Christ? Response: "I do."

Do you renounce the powers of evil and desire the freedom of new life in Christ? Response: "I do."

Do you profess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior? Response: "I do."

Do you promise, by the grace of God, to be Christ's disciple, to follow in the way of our Savior, to resist oppression and evil, to show love and justice, and to witness to the work and word of Jesus Christ as best you are able? *Response*: "I promise, with the help of God."

Do you promise, according to the grace given you, to grow in the Christian faith and to be a faithful member of the church of Jesus Christ, celebrating Christ's presence and furthering Christ's mission in all the world? *Response*: "I promise, with the help of God."

Do you promise to participate in the life and mission of this family of God's people, sharing regularly in the worship of God and enlisting in the work of this local church as it serves this community and the world? *Response*: "I promise, with the help of God."


We give thanks to God for all of our faithful members who live their lives in accordance with these vows made before God. Without their active participation in all aspects of church life as well as their financial support and sharing of their spiritual gifts, St. Paul's would not exist. Without them, our doors would have closed long ago, as so many churches have done in the recent years.

Unfortunately, many church members are quick to call upon the church in their time of need and expect the church to respond and support them, however, many of those same members do not feel the same need to support the church with either their attendance or gifts. Although there are exceptions, this often indicates they did not take their vows seriously. For them, membership is a one way street - it is all about taking care of themselves, and not about them taking care of others through the work of the church.

Churches do not need more names on a member list, rather, churches need more active participation and hands on support. Churches are not organizations full of paid staff members hired to serve its members like a country club, rather, churches are its members who take care of each other as a family.

We pray that all members who have not actively supported their church since they took their vows of participation have found a church where they are able to be part of the Body of Christ. If not, we pray that the Holy Spirit will lead them back to us, where together we can grow in our relationship with Christ and each other. St. Paul's and the Body of Christ need each and every one of its members, and we need them here with us. Please prayerfully consider how seriously you take the vows you made.
