

We will then provide the remaining items to reach our goal of 1000 items. The list provided is a guide to help provide three meals as well as the components of Thanksgiving dinner. However, we understand every household budget is different. So do not feel obligated to conform to this list. ANY 31 ITEMS WILL MAKE A HUGE IMPACT! Shop as you see items on sale, then bring your items to church during the month! You may leave your donation at the back of the sanctuary or contact Brook Koch-Guers at 570-449-0825 or by email at bkochguers@comcast.net to arrange for one of the boys to pick up your donation at your home. Come on St Paul's, TOGETHER we can do this and provide families with the BLESSING of a Thanksgiving meal!!!
- -Order forms are on the bulletin table and in the back of your bulletin for Christmas poinsettias!! Flower shops are requesting orders be extra early this year, so the deadline is next Sunday, October 27. The cost is \$9. Please contact Ardith Moyer or the church office if you need more information.
- -Next Sunday, October 27 is "Bring your motorcycle to church" Sunday, and a group ride will follow worship. Spread the word, invite your friend, and join us for some fun and fellowship. The Consistory has decided that we will continue to have the offering box and plates to drop off your offering before or after the service, but we will also have two ushers accept offerings during the Hymn of Reflection after the sermon as another option.
