

- -The Thanksgiving Food Drive challenge is happening now through October 31 (the drop of deadline is next Sunday, November 3): Our local pantries remain in dire need of food. Families across our county struggle each month to meet their food needs let alone provide the traditional Thanksgiving dinner we all enjoy. We have nearly 50 households within our congregation and we are asking 31 of those households to donate 31 food items in 31 days!! We will then provide the remaining items to reach our goal of 1000 items. The list provided is a guide to help provide three meals as well as the components of Thanksgiving dinner. However, we understand every household budget is different. So do not feel obligated to conform to this list. ANY 31 ITEMS WILL MAKE A HUGE IMPACT! Shop as you see items on sale, then bring your items to church during the month! You may leave your donation at the back of the sanctuary or contact Brook Koch-Guers at 570-449-0825 or by email at bkochguers@comcast.net to arrange for one of the boys to pick up your donation at your home. Come on St Paul's, TOGETHER we can do this and provide families with the BLESSING of a Thanksgiving meal!!!
- -We will have the All Saints Service of Remembrance next Sunday, November 3. That morning during the service of worship and communion, we will honor the saints who passed away in the past year. We will also collect the All Saints Offering, which assists retired pastors from our conference who are in need of financial assistance. Special envelopes are available by the bulletin basket.
- -The **Pennsylvania Conference Fall Meeting will be held on Saturday, November 9** at Good Shepherd Tuckerton, Reading. Registration opens at 9:00am and the meeting begins at 10:00am.
