

-A joint (with our Lutheran friends) Thanksgiving Eve worship service, with the Sacrament of Holy Communion, will be held this Wednesday, November 27 at 7:00 pm. The service will be held at St. Paul's Summer Hill Lutheran Church with Pastor Ken delivering the message.

-St. Paul's Annual Congregational Meeting will be held next Sunday, December 1 following Worship (the snow date will be December 8). The purpose of the meeting will be to review and vote on the proposed budget for 2025, and to elect new Consistory members. Please plan on attending this very important meeting.

-There are still a few names left for the Christian Education Committee's collection for the Schuylkill County Children and Youth. The names (along with ages and gift information) are posted on tags on the nursery window in the back of the sanctuary.
