Pastor's Page

Greetings Summer Hill,

In the church, we talk a lot about journeys. The idea of a journey is a great metaphor for how we travel through time, even when we do not physically go anywhere. We are on multiple journeys at once, both individually and collectively as a community of faith.

All journeys have certain things in common. They all have beginnings, steps along the way, and a destination. They differ in how they begin, the number and difficulty of steps, and not all journeys end up at the destination we envisioned when we started. There are different types of journeys, such as physical, spiritual, educational, professional, and so many more....I think you get the point.

During Lent, we are at the intersection of several important journeys. One is our journey following Christ to Jerusalem and the cross, which coincides with our spiritual journey and an introspective search of our hearts for what we believe and how we will respond to Jesus' call to "follow me." Jesus's journey to Jerusalem began when he committed to God's will, was baptized, and spent forty days in the wilderness. Even though Jesus knew the journey would take him through very difficult times and he would be tested physically, emotionally, and spiritually, he was committed to God's will.

Some of our physical journeys will take us to places we do not want to go either. That is when we need to search our hearts to find the same courage that Jesus had. The courage to continue through difficult times and do God's will does not come from us but from our faith in Jesus Christ, who is leading us to eternal life in God's Kingdom.

There are many wonderful, beautiful, and amazing steps along our spiritual journey, but sometimes we feel like we simply cannot go on. We each encounter roadblocks and are forced to take detours, which take us through dark valleys we wish we could have avoided. However, that is life. We are not the first, nor will we be the last ones to face such challenges.

The questions we must ask ourselves are, "How committed are we to reaching the final destination of God's Kingdom?" or, "Are we actually more committed to simply taking the most enjoyable earthly journey we can find?"

The Apostle Paul said, "We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ." (Ephesians 4:14–15, NRSV)

Are you ready to fully commit to Christ and to do God's will? Are you ready to take up your cross and journey with Christ, no matter what challenges we may face, so that you will one day arrive in God's Kingdom? If you are, a good start would be to take the advice of Stephen Covey's second of his *Seven Habits*, and 'Begin with the End in Mind.' We must have a clear vision of our desired destination and then begin now to pursue that future proactively. Otherwise, we will continue to be tossed to and fro.

As we finish the last few weeks of our Lenten journey, let us draw strength and courage from Jesus to follow him. Start by taking little steps, committed to doing the things your heart knows you must do. Keep focused on Jesus, learn his teachings, and implement those lessons in your life. Become part of the Body of Christ here on earth by becoming active at church, as we all strive to stay on the right path. The journey is hard, but together, we will be able to navigate the uncharted waters ahead, and help each other arrive at the place Jesus has prepared for us, as we also implement God's Kingdom in the here and now.

Lenten & Easter Season Worship Services

Wednesday evening Lenten services will be held **April 2** and **April 9** at 7pm. Please join us as we journey with Jesus to the cross.

A Palm Sunday Service, with the Blessing of the Palms, the Celebration of the Confirmation Class of 1975 and the Celebration of April Baptismal Anniversaries will be held on **Sunday, April 13** at 10:30am. There will also be a time of fellowship following the service, in the rear of the sanctuary.

On Maundy Thursday, April 17, at 6:00pm, we will gather in the fellowship hall for our version of the Seder meal. Seder is a transliteration of the Hebrew סדר, which means 'order' or 'procedure'. The name also expresses the conduct of the meal, all the dishes, the blessings, the prayers, the stories and the songs, written in the Haggadah, a book that determines the order of Passover and tells the story of the Exodus from Egypt. To help in the food preparation, there is a sign-up sheet by the bulletin basket on the table in the narthex. Help is needed to prepare food during the day. If you are able to help, please speak to Pastor Ken.

A Good Friday Tenebrae Service will be held on **April 18** at 7:00pm. Tenebrae is the Latin term for shadows. It is a service of lessons accompanied by the gradual extinguishing of lights to represent the death of Jesus Christ.

Easter Sunday, April 20: We will rejoice and celebrate Christ's resurrection beginning with our Sunrise Service at 6:30am on Easter morning. An Easter Breakfast will be held in the fellowship hall at approximately 7:15am. There is a breakfast sign-up sheet by the bulletin basket on the table in the narthex. Donations of desserts are welcome and appreciated. The breakfast is followed immediately by a worship service with Holy Communion around the breakfast table (8:15am). Sunday School will be held at 9:15am, followed by the 10:30am Easter Worship Service with Holy Communion.


